- 1. Higher education sector has been developed in terms of premises, programmes and number of students to meet the demand of the economic development.
- 2. I'm not going to talk about the key role of the higher education sector **my focus** would be on the contribution which the higher education should be making on **unemployability** and working with the **community and industry** to solve some **economic and social challenges**.
- 3. Managing the higher education sector is complex and not easy, it's like managing one of the 500 fortune companies. It has a lot of stakeholders and expectations.
- 4. We have to deal with students, parents, staff, board of trustees, board of directors, legislation bodies, society and the industry.
- 5. The expectation is that the higher education sector should provide leading examples for other sectors in the society.
- 6. UNESCO highlighted 3 key roles for the higher education sector:
  - i. Teaching and learning
  - ii. Research
  - iii. Community service



- 1. The original task of the universities and colleges was to create knowledge
- A lot of people join the higher education sector because they want the skills and the job.
- 3. The technology is moving so fast and everything around us is getting automated
- 4. Everyone talks about the **digital future (internet of things)**
- 5. It's very **difficult to predict the future** specially with the **fast development of the technology** however there's clear views of the **future skills** which can be summarise as follows:
  - i. Hard skills (Graduate with multi skills)
  - ii. Soft skills (Personal, interpersonal and situational skills)
  - iii. Emotional intelligent skills
  - iv. Technological skills
  - v. Entrepreneur skills



- 1. Different people might give you different answers.
- 2. People will agree that good education means graduates with the knowledge, hard skills, soft skills and employability skills.
- 3. One of the challenges we have here in Oman is the relationship between the higher education sector and the industry.
- 4. What I mean by the industry is the world of the employability.
- 5. I'm not going to talk about the job of the futures, there are a lot of scientific studies highlights this
- 6. My question is to the VCs and the deans:
  - i. Is your university or college ready for the future challenges?
  - ii. What are you doing about it?
- 7. If **Oman approves distance learning**, then the **higher education sector in Oman will get huge competition from the world**. Students will have more options and **universities without boundaries** concept will be available to everyone.
